It is very disruptive for a student to come to class after having missed 3 classes, and it is hard to "catch up" at that point; therefore, the policy will remain firm.

2009-2010 Religious Education Begins Today

Younger Grades Start September 13th: Children ages Pre-K (age 4) through 6th grade start classes TODAY, September 13th, from 8:45-9:45 am in the Parish Hall. All parents and children are to come to the Parish Hall for classroom assignments. Parents, please do your best to have your child come to class on time, and remember to always be on time picking them up, as Catechists also need to have some extra time to make it to Mass.

1st Reconciliation/1st Holy Communion Preparation will also take place at this time. This is a 2-year course, and if your child will just be joining us, they do need to complete 1 year before entering into the Preparation Class (some exceptions apply).

Youth Starts Wednesday, September 16th: Remember that for grades 7th-12th, Youth will now be on Wednesday evenings from 7-8:30 pm. There will also be an Open Gym from 6:30-7 pm for all youth to come and hang out with one another and their leaders. We look forward to having everyone back on our first **Welcome Back Night!** There will be games, prizes, and lots of fellowship and fun! See you there!

High School Confirmation Preparation will also begin on this night. High School Freshmen and older are eligible to enter into the Confirmation Program. Students must complete the 2-year course and be 16 years of age to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

There are three interwoven themes in today's readings: listening to God, faith vs. good works, and losing our life in order to find it. How are they related?

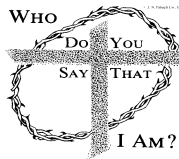
