**TODAY IS THE FINAL DAY TO REGISTER FOR R.E.** If your child is not registered and in class by September 27th, then they will have to wait another year to join the classes. It is very disruptive for a student to come to class after having missed 3 classes, and it is hard to "catch up" at that point; therefore, the policy will remain firm.

**Classes for Grades Pre-K thru 6th Are on Sunday:** Children ages Pre-K (age 4) through 6th grade have classes on Sunday from 8:45-9:45 am in the Parish Hall. Parents, please do your best to have your child come to class on time, and remember to always be on time picking them up, as Catechists also need to have some extra time to make it to Mass.

**1st Reconciliation/1st Holy Communion Preparation** also takes place at this time. This is a 2-year course, and if your child will just be joining us, they do need to complete 1 year before entering into the Preparation Class (some exceptions apply).

**Youth 7th Grade-High School Classes Are on Wednesday Nights:** Remember that for grades 7th-12th, classes are on Wednesday evenings from 7-8:30 pm. There is also an Open Gym from 6:30-7 pm for all youth to come and hang out with one another and their leaders.

**High School Confirmation Preparation** is also on this night. High School Freshmen and older are eligible to enter into the Confirmation Program. Students must complete the 2-year course and be 16 years of age to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

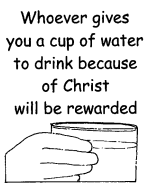
**People in Need of Receiving the Sacraments:** If you are either an adult or child (over the age of 7) who has never been Baptized, received 1st Reconciliation, 1st Holy Communion or Adult Confirmation, you are invited to attend the RCIA/ADULT CONFIRMATION or RCIC formation classes at the Shrine. Classes for adults are every Wednesday through the Easter Vigil. Classes for children are every other Wednesday. Please call Sarah in the Office for further details. Classes have begun, so if you desire the Sacraments you will need to join ASAP!!!

**NOT AGAINST US**

Like Moses before him, Jesus corrects his disciples' misunderstanding of the gift of the Spirit. They saw people who were not of their company casting out demons and doing other works such as Jesus had done. He goes on to point out the importance of the "little ones": the poor, simple people, children, the meek ones who are not important in the world. God builds the coming reign little by little in our actions, however small and unassuming, when they are done out of love of God and neighbor.
