CHRIST FORETOLD

In Genesis, Melchizedek is described as a king who is also a priest. As this story is usually interpreted, Melchizedek's action of bringing out bread and wine and blessing it with praise to the Creator is a prophetic action. Seen as a prefigurement of the action of Jesus, he foretells to Abram the One who is to come, the Messiah. The psalm echoes this theme in the time of David the King, who praises and thanks God and proclaims the preexistence of the Christ, who is given princely power from "the day of your birth, in holy splendor" (Psalm 110:3). God has promised this to David and his descendants forever, and God will never go back on this promise.

The New English Translation of the Roman Missal

For the last several years, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has been working in conjunction with the other English-speaking conferences on a new English translation of the Roman Missal. This translation is a more literal rendering of the Latin text, which is the universal text for the Mass. The English translation has received official approval from the Vatican (called *recognitio*). In 12 to 18 months, the churches in the United States can expect the full implementation of this publication.

Here are a few examples of the changes in the people's responses at Mass. Currently the priest says, "The Lord be with you," and the people respond, "And also with you." In the new translation the priest will say, "The Lord be with you," and the people will respond, "And with your spirit." During the Creed, the people currently say, "We believe in one God...of all that is seen and unseen...in one Lord Jesus Christ...eternally begotten of the Father...one in being with the Father." In the new translation the people will say, "I believe in one God...of all things visible and invisible...in one Lord Jesus Christ...born of the Father before all ages...consustantial with the Father."

These changes are not whimsical. They are a response to the 2001 document, *Liturgiam Authenticam*, produced by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments. This document specifically addresses "the use of vernacular (or common) languages in the publication of the books of the Roman Liturgy." Bishop Arthur Serratelli, chair of the USCCB committee on Divine Worship, wrote an essay, "Welcoming the Roman Missal," published in *America Magazine* discussing the very issues, challenges, and benefits coming with the implementation of the new Missal (please see http://www.americanmagazine.org/content/article.cfm?article_id=12140).
